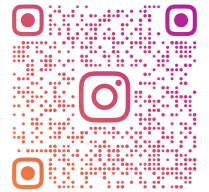

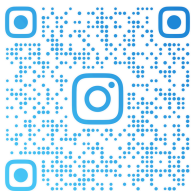

# Message From Fr. Kramer Cameron, LC

Dear Families and Friends of Santi Apostoli,

Happy Sunday! Today's readings are full of great insights and so as we prepare for Lent, I would like reflect with you on them asking also a few questions. The First Reading from Ecclesiasticus 27 reads, "The orchard where a tree grows is judged on the quality of its fruit." How is the orchard where you grow? How is your fruit? Do you bear good fruit or bad fruit?

Psalm 91 reminds us that, "It is good to give you thanks, O Lord." How often do we give thanks to God during our day?

1 Corinthians 16 says, "Death is swallowed up in victory. Death, where is your victory? Death, where is your sting?" Do we live with fear? Worry? Anxiety? Or do we trust in a God who has conquered sin and death?

In the Gospel of Luke chapter 6 we read, "Can one blind man guide another? Surely both will fall into a pit?" Who are your leaders? Who do you follow? Do you follow Jesus? Do you listen to Jesus? Jesus again uses the tree analogy, "There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit." This let, let us nourish our hearts, our lives, on the Word of God, his mercy, the Eucharist so that we can live our lives to the full. If we do, we will live out today's Alleluia: "You will shine in the world like bright stars because you are offering it the word of life."

Let us also continue to pray for Pope Francis who is still in the hospital. Let us also pray that in this time of suffering he also finds peace in the depths of his heart.
